BESTINE NOT BEST

Bestine follow up. According to the APS Bestine has an adverse effect on a number of stamp inks; causing some inks to complete disappear or fading into a non-readable color. Also any stamps removed from paper using Bestine should not be mounding in stamp albums with any other mounted stamps, due to the fact that the Bestine will leech throughout the album pages on to the other mounted stamps; especially if albums are stored so that pages are pressed tightly together, which speeds up the leeching process. It should also be noted that Bestine is highly flammable and toxic. So don't store the stamps albums near space heaters or in unventilated areas. No tests as to the toxicity effect on the environment has been stated yet, although anyone with breathing or heart related illness should stay away from this method of removal or stamp storage.

Also... the talc added to the back of the stamp does indeed eliminate the stickiness, but when the stamps are hinges and pressed in the stamp album the acrylic adhesiveness does return and the stamp will be stuck on to the page or in the stock pocket. Try using a pencil easer after the Bestine removes the stamp from paper, it works some what. Foremost... never store the same removed stamps in the same glassine, for next step is the trash can.

CURACAO LINN'S JAN 3, 2011
