Philatelic News


- New US Issues for June:
 - Waterfalls (June 13) A series of 12 stamps showing beautiful waterfalls from all over the US.
 - Tundra Swans (Federal Duck Stamp) (June 23) The annual waterfowl hunting stamp which raises funds to maintain US wetlands.





 The USPS has 2 First Day Issues scheduled during the Great American Stamp Show in Cleveland (August 10 − 13): Life Magnified and Thinking of You. Life Magnified is a series of 20 stamps showing close-ups of everyday things magnified. Thinking of You is a series of fun stamps to show that you are thinking of someone when you mail them a card or letter.





 The USPS has a new spray-on postmark to go with the Endangered Species Stamps released in May. It has a black-footed ferret and the words "Protect Endangered Species". As you might guess, this postmark can be interesting when combined with certain stamps!



Collector's Corner

- Show and Tell is at the second meeting of each month. Please bring an item to show and talk about. It can be about a topic other than stamps. Sharing the story is the important part.
- I am always fascinated by the articles in Linn's and the American Philatelist magazines about the history of the actual stamps, especially thise that were never issued. The May 2023 issue of Scott's Stamp Magazine had an article about an entire stamp series that was never issued, but were actually printed and ready for sale. In 2013 The USPS had announced, commissioned, created (by artist Eli Noyes, who created the "Go Green" stamps of 2011) and printed a series of Forever stamps called "Just Move!" It was to be issued in conjuction with First Lady

Michelle Obama's childhood-anti-obesity initiative. It showed 15 drawings of kids engaged in healthy activities such as organized sports and things like walking, climbing ropes, skateboarding and skipping rope.



The title had been vetted to not be exactly the same as the First Lady's or the NFL initiative "Play 360" and cause any other copywrite issues. The problem came when the First Lady's office was presented with the stamps. Her staff pointed out safety issues, such as no helmets or knee pads on the kids, and the fact that most pools did not allow cannonballs when swimming. The USPS was worried that without the participation of the First Lady the stamp campaign would not work. The stamps were put into storage and the USPS moved on with other new issues such as the "Inverted Jenny" and "Harry Potter" stamps. Eventually in 2014 the stamps were all shredded except for approval and archived sheets.
