- New US Issues for October:
 - Ruth Bader Ginsburg (Oct. 2) This stamp honors the Supreme Court Justice from New York who was pivotal in getting women's equality in the US.
 - Winter Woodland Animals (Oct. 10) A series of 4 stamps for the holidays, northern animals in their winter habitat. Designed by Antonio Alcalá with art by Katie Kirk, they are in the style of Charley Harper.






 Counterfeit US 2010 Love Stamp is too big! By Charles Snee, Linn's Stamp News, 9/25/23



According to counterfeit stamp specialist Darrell Ertzberger, a new variety of counterfeit stamps have been discovered – the 44 cent Love stamp from 2010 (Scott 4450). He found these on a website that no longer exists through Facebook Ads. He also purchased counterfeit Chief Standing Bear (2023) and the Charlie Brown Christmas stamps of 2015, which were the correct size. The Love sheets were tagged in the same way most Chinese counterfeits are, pale green that appears as reddish pink under shortwave ultraviolet light.

Linn's compared the counterfeit sheet to a genuine sheet purchased at the Great American Stamp Show. The size difference is clear. The makers of counterfeit stamps have gotten very good, getting correct things like paper quality, tagging, ink, and die-cutting; so good that ordinary purchasers cannot tell the difference, which is perhaps why the makers of these stamps didn't worry (or care) about the size difference.

The total numbers of counterfeit US stamps has exploded since 2021, and for this reason Scott's now has a "Specialized Catalog of US Counterfeits", a separate book, now available.



• West Point Stamp designed by Army Officer - By Charles Snee, Scott Stamp Monthly June 2023 – from an interview with Mick Zais, US Army (retired)



Stamps can be designed by anyone – many are done by commission from the USPS. The Army/Navy stamp series of 1937 is a classic set for US collectors. The 1 cent through 4 cent stamps feature important historical leaders of the Armed Forces, and the 5 cent stamps highlight the appropriate Military Academy for that service. Retired Army Officer Mick Zais is a West Point graduate and former APS President. His topical collections are West Point and West Point Graduates on stamps and the Army stamps in the 1937 series. He said that the 5 cent West Point stamp from 1937 is the only stamp known to have been designed by a military officer. Cavalry Officer Captain L.E. Schick, West Point Class of 1920 was assigned as an instructor in the Department of Drawing when asked to design the stamp. Army officers had to learn drawing because they had to be able to scout and accurately draw the landscape in which they might be engaged in battle. Aspects of this are still included in basic map reading classes for 4th Classmen.

Collector's Corner

- Show and Tell is at the second meeting of each month. Please bring an item to show and talk about. It can be about a topic other than stamps. Sharing the story is the important part.
- Show and Tell from September 24th:
 - Danielle had her collection of Rattlesnake Island OH stamps, which she will show once they are in the album.
 - Bill had a cool cover from the dollar box postmarked "USS
 California" before the US was in WWII. The ship was damaged at
 Pearl Harbor but was repaired and fought in many pivotal Pacific
 actions. He also had a cover from the USS Wasp before the war.
 This ship was sunk during the war (see below).

Maureen brought a centerpiece (glass block with sparkly pictures glued to surface) from her 40th Class Reunion at the US Merchant Marine Academy showing the 3 cent Merchant Marine stamp from 1946. She also talked about the history of the Merchant Marine during wartime and why it is important to the US economy. (The USMMA Battle Standard is pictured below.)
