## 50 YEARS AGO - JANUARY 1962



NEW MEXICO STATEHOOD - 50<sup>th</sup> ANNIV. ISSUED JANUARY 6<sup>th</sup>

HISTORICAL FACTS WITH PHILATELIC CONNECTIONS

OVER THE YEARS, STAMPS HAVE BEEN ISSUED FOR THE BEATLES, JACKIE ROBINSON AND THE TROLLEY TRANSPORTATION TOPIC

JAN 4, 1962 - The Beatles' first record to bill them under that name, the 45 rpm recording of "My Bonnie" was released by Polydor. Credited to "Tony Sheridan & The Beatles", the record had "The Saints" on the other side.

JAN 23, 1962 - In his first year of eligibility, Jackie Robinson was elected to the Baseball Hall Of Fame, receiving 124 of the 160 ballots cast and becoming the first African-American to be enshrined at Cooperstown.

JAN 28, 1962 – The last streetcar in Washington, D.C. ran for the final time at 2:00 am, as the transit company retired its 27 car fleet. The day before, free rides were offered for all children accompanied by a paying adult and thousands took advantage of the offer. By 1962, only ten American cities still had trolleys.
