3. 50 Years ago - March 1963

1966 PONTIAC GTO. The "little GTO?" Of course. The first GTO was the product of dropping a 389-cubic-inch V-8 engine into an intermediate-size Pontiac Tempest LeMans. It became a legend -- both on the street and in song.

1967 SHELBY GT-500. Carroll Shelby seemed like he could never get enough horsepower out of a Ford Mustang, but he sure tried. This one was powered by a 428-cubic-inch V-8 producing 355 horsepower. The car had a rear spoiler and optional dealer-installed LeMans stripes. Only 2.048 were built, making it a true classic today.

1969 DODGE CHARGER DAYTONA. With its weird 18-inch nosepiece and rear-mounted wing, there was no mistaking the Daytona. It was a street car built entirely to win stock car races, which it did in its NASCAR debut at Alabama International Motor Speedway in Talladega. Chrysler made 503 of them, three more than were needed to qualify as a stock car.

1970 CHEVROLET CHEVELLE SS. The SS, of course, stood for Super Sport. What made it super was its optional engine 454-cubic-inch V-8. It featured a black grille and SS emblems on both the grille and the rear bumper.

1970 PLYMOUTH HEMI 'CUDA. This car was so fast that it officially cut off the first part of the name Barracuda. It has a 426-cubic-inch Hemi V-8 producing 425 horsepower, making it a cornerstone of what Plymouth called its "Rapid Transit System." About 700 were made.



A BRIEF HISTORY

Saint Patrick – (born c. 387 – died March 17 c. 460 or c. 492) was a Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Known as the "Apostle of Ireland", he is the primary patron saint of the island, along with Saints Brigid and Columba.

Two authentic letters from him survive, from which come the only generally-accepted details of his life. When he was about 16, he was captured from his home by pagan raiders and taken as a slave to Ireland, where he lived for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland as an ordained bishop, but little is known about the places where he worked. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland. Most available details of his life are from subsequent hagiographies and these are now not accepted without detailed criticism. The actual dates of Patrick's life cannot be fixed with certainty but, on a widespread interpretation, he was active as a missionary in Ireland during the second half of the 5th century. He is generally credited with being the first bishop of Armagh, Primate of All Ireland.

Saint Patrick's Day is observed on March 17, the date of his death. It is celebrated both inside and outside Ireland, as both a liturgical and non-liturgical holiday. In the dioceses of Ireland, it is both a solemnity and a holy day of obligation; outside Ireland, it can be a celebration of Ireland itself.

ST. PATRICK, MISOURI

St. Patrick (current population 17)

was settled by a small group of Irish immigrants in 1833. They originally named their town North Santa Fe before changing the name to St. Marysville in 1854. The town underwent another name change just a few years later, when it tried to establish its own post office. "There was another St. Marysville in Clark County, so we had to change the name," said St. Patrick publicity Chairwoman Ellen Krueger. The local priest suggested the name St. Patrick to honor the patron saint of Ireland, and after the town changed its name for the third time, it got its post office. That post office would later play an important role in bringing more Irish culture into the town. To send mail by St. Patrick's commemorative cancellation, send stamped, self-addressed envelopes requesting the special cancellation to Postmaster, St. Patrick, MO 63466. MAR 4, 1963 - Kuwait was admitted to the United Nations by unanimous vote of the General Assembly, after the Soviet Union dropped its opposition to the emirate's membership.

MAR 4, 1963 - The Mona Lisa was displayed in the United States for the last time, when the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City closed at 9:00 pm.

MAR 5, 1963 - Patsy Cline, country singer dies in a plane crash at 30 along with Cowboy Copas, Hawkshaw Hawkins, and Cline's manager and pilot Randy Hughes. They were returning home from a benefit performance in Kansas when their single-engine plane went down in a wooded area near Camden, Tennessee, killing all on board.
