

FIRST MAN ON THE MOON

Neil Alden Armstrong (August 5, 1930 -August 25, 2012) was an American astronaut and the first person to walk on the Moon. He was also an aerospace engineer, naval aviator, test pilot, and university professor. Before becoming an astronaut, Armstrong was an officer in the U.S. Navy and served in the Korean War.

A participant in the U.S. Air Force's Man In Space Soonest and X-20 Dyna-Soar human spaceflight programs, Armstrong joined the NASA Astronaut Corps in 1962, and made his first space flight as command pilot of Gemini 8 in 1966, becoming NASA's first civilian astronaut to fly in space. On this mission, he performed the first docking of two spacecraft with pilot David Scott.

Armstrong's second and last spaceflight was as mission commander of the Apollo 11 moon landing in July 1969. On this mission, Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin descended to the lunar surface and spent two and one-half hours exploring, while Michael Collins remained in orbit in the Command Module. Armstrong was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Richard Nixon along with Collins and Aldrin, the Congressional Space Medal of Honor by President Jimmy Carter in 1978, and the Congressional Gold Medal with his former crewmates in 2009.

MEMBER PROFILE - FRED LEWIS

Fred Lewis, a lifelong resident of the Pittsburgh area started collecting stamps at the age of 10 years old.

HOW HE GOT STARTED

His interest started when he saw a display rack of packet stamps at the Woolworth's store in downtown Pittsburgh.

WHAT HE COLLECTED AND NOW COLLECTS

Fred started, like most other beginning collectors, with a worldwide collection. After a few years, he started to specialize in U.S. Telegraph stamps and is proud to say that he has been collecting this area for over 50 years!

His collection also includes telegrams and other non-philatelic related telegraph memorabilia.

Other stamp collecting interests includes PNC (Plate Number Coil stamps), stamps and postal history with "colored" postmarks (purple, green, red, etc.).

Also Fred is in the process of creating a stamp postmark "date calendar" by finding stamps postmarked (cancelled) with a legible date (month and day). He is currently about 50% complete.

Other non-philatelic interests are model trains.

FAVORITE U.S. TELEGRAPH STAMPS

Fred's favorite telegraph stamps are Scott #16T99 through #16T103, the five (56) stamps that feature a portrait of Samuel F. B. Morse. These stamps were issued in 1940 and were engraved by Security Bank Note Company of Philadelphia, PA.
