STAMP COLLECTING: INVERTED JENNY SHEET

The sheet includes six Inverted Jenny stamps, reprinted with an updated \$2.00 denomination and surrounded by an illustration that includes the National Postal Museum in Washington, D.C.; the route of the first regularly scheduled airmail service between Washington, Philadelphia, and New York; and aviation pioneer Reuben H. Fleet, who was in charge of the first group of pilots.

Originally issued on May 14, 1918, to commemorate the start of the first regular airmail service the following day, the original Jenny stamp was designed to show a Curtiss JN-4H, or "Jenny," the biplane used to deliver the mail. However, one sheet of 100 stamps that mistakenly showed the biplane upside down was sold on the first day of issue to a collector in Washington, D.C. - and one of the greatest philatelic treasures in U.S. history was released into the world.

The art director for this souvenir sheet was Antonio Alcalá. The selvage artwork was created by Steven Noble.

BATTLE OF LAKE ERIE

The stamp's subject for the second year of the war is the Battle of Lake Erie, which took place on September 10, 1813. For the stamp design, the Postal Service selected William Henry Powell's famous painting, Battle of Lake Erie. The oil-on-canvas painting, completed in 1873, was commissioned by the U.S. Congress and placed at the head of the east stairway in the Senate wing of the Capitol. It depicts Oliver Hazard Perry in the small boat he used to transfer from his ruined flagship, the Lawrence, to the Niagara. Art director Greg Breeding designed this stamp.

MUSIC ICONS - RAY CHARLES

The U.S. Postal Service proudly honors inspiring musician Ray Charles with a stamp, one of several that inaugurates the Music Icons series.

The stamp art features an image of Charles, taken later in his career, by photographer Yves Carrère. The stamp sheet was designed to evoke the appearance of a vintage 45 rpm record sleeve. Art director Ethel Kessler worked on the stamp sheet with designer Neal

APS NEWSLETTER AWARD: The Club has been awarded a VERMEIL award for our 2012 newsletter. The APS judges the last three issues of the calendar year. For 2012 the three judges awarded 85, 83 and 75 points for an average of 81.3, only 3.67 points from the GOLD. With improvements, based on judges' work sheets, we may get that gold this year.

Awards, based on average points, are: Gold, Vermeil, Silver, Silver-Bronze and Bronze. Points are awarded based on nine different areas within three categories: Content Coverage (60 point maximum), Production Quality (40 point maximum) and Bonus Points of 0 to 10 additional points. The APS issues a certificate and displays the submitted newsletters and their awards at the annual APS Stampshow. This year it was in Milwaukee, Wisconsin August 8-11.

There were 16 stamp clubs that entered newsletters in the competition. Awards were 6 GOLD, 9 VERMEIL and 1 SILVER.

A BRIEF HISTORY

Francis DeSales Ouimet (May 8, 1893 – September 2, 1967) was an American golfer, who is frequently referred to as the "father of amateur golf" in the United States. He won the U.S. Open in 1913, and was the first non-Briton elected Captain of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews. He was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1974.

The 1913 U.S. Open was the 19th U.S. Open, held September 18–20 at The Country Club in Brookline, Massachusetts, a suburb southwest of Boston. Amateur Francis Ouimet, age 20, won his only U.S. Open title in an 18-hole playoff, five strokes ahead of Britons Harry Vardon and Ted Ray. His caddy was 10-year-old Eddie Lowery

The first two rounds were played Thursday and the final two rounds on Friday. At the end of regulation, there was a three-way tie. Ouimet defeated Vardon and Ray in a Saturday playoff round. Ouimet won with a score of 72 (–2), Vardon was second with 77, and Ray came in third with a 78. It was widely hailed as a stunning upset over the strongly-favored Britons and increased the popularity of the game in the United States.

Ouimet's victory was the first of eight times an amateur won the U.S. Open; Bobby Jones won four and the last was Johnny Goodman in 1933.

FRANCIS OUIMET STAMP

The Francis Ouimet stamp (Scott Catalogue #2377) with a denomination of 25-cents was issued on June 13, 1988 commemorating the 75th anniversary of his U.S. Open Golf Championship of 1913.

Designed by M. Gregory Rudd and printed by the American Bank Note Company. The stamp was printed in PHOTOGRAVURE in plates of 200 in four panes of 50.

First Day Ceremonies were held at Brookline, Massachusetts on June 18, 1988 where the 1988 U.S. Open Golf Championship was being held. There were 383,168 FDC's that received the First Day cancel.

HISTORICAL FACTS WITH PHILATELIC CONNECTIONS

OVER THE YEARS, STAMPS HAVE BEEN ISSUED FOR "Red Grange", Football, Malaysia, Baseball & Space

<u>SEPTEMBER 7, 1963</u> - The Pro Football Hall of Fame opened in Canton, Ohio, with 17 charter members, including Harold Edward "Red" Grange, "The Galloping Ghost."

SEPTEMBER 16, 1963 - Malaysia was formed through the merger of the 11-states of the Federation of Malaya and the British colonies of Singapore, North Borneo (renamed Sabah) and Sarawak.

SEPTEMBER 18, 1963 - The last sports event took place at the Polo Grounds in New York City, with baseball's New York Mets losing to the Philadelphia Phillies, 5-1 before a crowd of only 1,752 people.

SEPTEMBER 20, 1963 - At the United Nations, U.S. President John F. Kennedy proposed a joint moon mission between the USA and the Soviet Union. The Soviet Union Communist Party newspaper Pravda reported the speech, but commented that the idea as "premature". Kennedy would die two months later, and Soviet Chairman Khrushchev would be deposed within 13 months, and the United States would proceed alone in its lunar program.
