

Philatelic News

- April US Stamps currently scheduled for release:
 - Shel Silverstein (April 8th) Celebrating renowned children's author with a scene from "The Giving Tree".
 - Flags on Barns (April 14th) 4 different designs Coil stamps picturing iconic US Barns with flags painted on the sides.
 - George Morrison (April 22nd) 5 different designs Honoring the Minnesota Ojibwe artist with 5 of his colorful abstract landscape paintings.







• An article in Linn's (3/7/22) says that as of the end of 2021 Sweden's post office, Postnord, is introducing every-second-day delivery of mail. This means that mail is delivered Monday, Wednesday and Friday one week and the next week it is delivered Tuesday and Thursday (mail hasn't been delivered on Saturdays in Sweden for awhile). They also closed all of their offices several years ago, having postal counters in supermarkets and similar stores. While much of Sweden is rural-type delivery, these changes apply to the cities as well. Many people in the country use digital delivery of bills, so they don't have to wait for physical delivery, it still delays other mail including daily newspapers. Changes in other parts of the world may show how our mail delivery in the US may be affected in the future.







- In response to the invasion of Ukraine, The USPS has temporarily suspended all mail service to Russia as of March 11th. Military and diplomatic service has not been affected. In addition, several countries including Georgia and Romania have announced free mail service to Ukraine. The Federation of European Philatelic Associations have recommended that Russia and Belarus not be allowed to participate in any upcoming philatelic events.
- The House and Senate have both passed legislation designed to relieve the USPS of obligations for paying retiree's health care well before people retire, which since 2006 have cost the USPS over \$50 billion dollars.
 Retirees will now be expected to sign up for Medicare. For more information check out the article in Linn's (3/28/22).

Collector's Corner

• The process to create a US stamp is long and complicated (which is likely why we have not yet had a stamp commemorating the heroes of Covid-19). That's why I loved the article in Linn's (3/28/22) about Ukraine's stamp design contest. On February 24th, a week after the beginning of Russia's invasion, the Ukraine Post Office, Ukrposhta, announced plans to issue a stamp illustrating Ukrainians' determination to defend their homeland. They revived nearly 500 designs before the March 4th deadline. They posted the top 20 designs on their Facebook page and will pick one for issuance. The theme was "Telling a Russian warship go f--- yourself!" This phrase comes from the Ukranian defenders of Snake Island, which was attacked by 2 Russian ships on Feb. 24th. Supposedly one of those ships has since been destroyed. The submissions came from all over the world, including from children and professional artists.

In the late 1800s, officials were worried that people were "recycling" stamps by washing the cancels away and using them again. So they gambled on an experiment – a grilling machine invented by Charles F. Steel. From 1867-75, Steel's machine used a roller pitted with either small depressions or small raised pyramids to break fibers in stamp paper. The rollers with depressions created a "points up" pattern while those with raised pyramids made a "points down" pattern.

These broken fibers allowed cancellation ink to thoroughly penetrate the paper. This meant even regular pen ink, which was used to cancel stamps at smaller post offices, would be impossible to remove completely. The experiment was short-lived, ending in 1875.

Early in the 20th century, William Stevenson categorized grills by size and shape, and sorted the stamps by "grill family." Identifying grills is fun. There is a chart at the Mystic Website to help you with grills.
